LOG BOOK EXCERPT FROM THE WHALE SHIP "ESSEX"

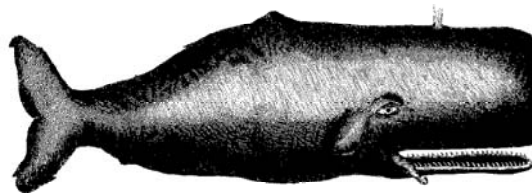

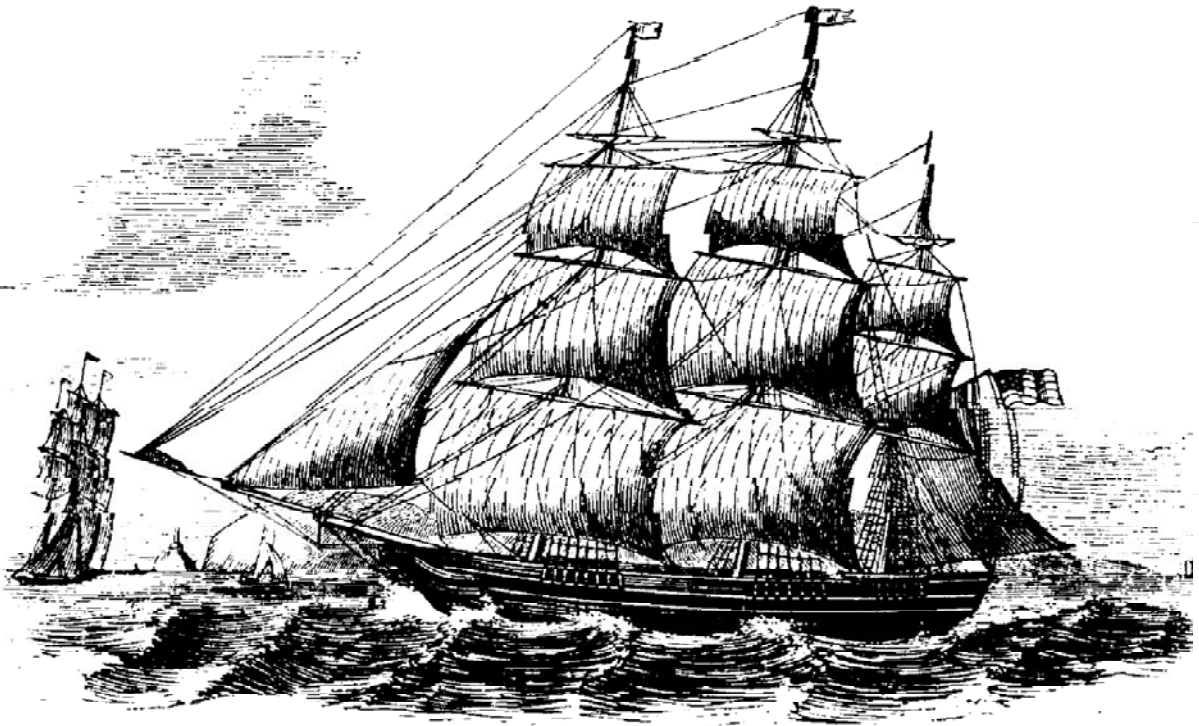
